His areas of research include the health workforce, rural health, health policy, program evaluation, and medical sociology. He is a recipient of many research grants and an author of many articles and reports.

This presentation is based on a study that tracks family physicians who received their family medicine residency training in northern Ontario. In particular, the study examines the extent to which family physicians trained in northern Ontario worked in northern Ontario and other rural communities. The study has broader implications for rural/northern health workforce planning.
