Health Services and Policy Research: Priorities and Opportunities

This session will provide an overview of the Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR) Institute of Health Services and Policy Research, including its major initiatives and upcoming funding opportunities. Initiatives that will be featured include the Strategy for Patient-Oriented Research, Community-based Primary Health Care, e-Health Innovations and the first-ever pan-Canadian Vision and Strategy for health services and policy research. This will be an opportunity to engage with the Institute's Scientific Director and learn more about the Institute's initiatives and how to get involved.

The Dean's Hour is a discussion forum for clinical, human and medical sciences faculty, learners, senior leaders and community partners. Join us to listen and converse with distinguished speakers on topics related to rural, community-engaged, health professional education and research, organizational development and change.

Dr. Robyn Tamblyn is a Professor in the Department of Medicine and the Department of Epidemiology and Biostatistics at McGill University. She is a James McGill Chair, a Medical Scientist at the McGill University Health Center Research Institute, and the Scientific Director of the Clinical and Health Informatics Research Group at McGill University. Dr. Tamblyn's ground-breaking research on educational outcomes has elucidated credentialing policies. Her work on prescription drug use, its determinants, and computerized interventions to improve drug safety have been recognized internationally. She leads a CIHR-funded team to investigate the use of e-health technologies to support integrated care for chronic disease, and co-leads a Canadian Foundation for Innovation Informatics Laboratory to create advanced technologies to monitor adverse events in the Journal of the American Medical Association, the Annals of Internal Medicine, the British Medical Journal, Medical Care, and Health Services Research among others. She has been awarded the CHSRF KT award for her research in improving the use of medication as well as the ACFAS Bombardier award for innovation in the development of a computerized drug management system.
