Aboriginal Peoples in Canada: Aging, Health and Health Care

Aboriginal Peoples represent over 4 percent of Canada's total population. While the Aboriginal population is younger than the general population, the 2001 Census of Canada reveals a trend towards aging among Aboriginal Peoples. But very little is known about the health status and health care experiences of older Aboriginal peoples. Using data from the 2001 Aboriginal Peoples Survey (APS) and the 2000/2001 Canadian Community Health Survey (CCHS), this presentation will examine differences in health status and access to care between older Aboriginal peoples and the non-Aboriginal population in Canada. Based on the results of the analysis presented, Aboriginal leaders and planners need to start planning now for the aging Aboriginal population.

Professor Mark W. Rosenberg received his Ph.D. (1980) from the London School of Economics. He is currently Professor of Geography and cross appointed as a Professor in the Department of Community Health and Epidemiology at Queen's University in Kingston. He has previously held academic appointments at the University of California at Los Angeles, the University of Ottawa and Carleton University. Professor Rosenberg is the Chairperson of the International Geographical Union Commission on Health and the Environment. He is the Editor-in-Chief of the *Canadian Journal on Aging* and a North American Editor of *Environment and Planning: Government and Policy*. He is author or co-author of over 200 publications and scientific papers. In 2006, Professor Rosenberg became the first winner of the Queen's University Award for Excellence in Graduate Student Supervision in the Social Sciences and Humanities.
